Report from the Meeting:

Building Update

Our Building Project is going well and we are delighted to see such great progress! The ground floor precast floors are in place and drainage work is complete. It is hoped that brick work and steel work will be up to first floor level by the middle of February. The procurement procedure for furniture and IT equipment for the new extension has begun.

Attendance:

We have the second of our Focus on Attendance Weeks this week. There are draws each day for spot prizes, and raffles at the end of the week. All pupils who have attended for five out of five days this week will be included in both a class raffle and a school raffle. We encourage all of our pupils to be **Attendance HEROS** (Here, Every day, Ready for school, On time). Our Statement of Strategy for Attendance was ratified at the meeting and this will be published shortly on the school website.

Catholic Schools Week is being celebrated in the school this week $(22^{nd} - 26^{th})$ January). Fr. Noel opened Catholic Schools Week with a short prayer service over the intercom. This year's theme is 'Catholic Schools: Communities of Service'.

First Penance will be celebrated on Tuesday, 7th February in St. Mary's Church at 7.30pm. 33 pupils from Second Classes will receive the sacrament of penance on that evening.

Fr. Noel Weir, as our chaplain, is a regular visitor to sacramental classes and other classes and we appreciate the time he gives us in St. Joseph's.

Retreat for Sacramental Classes:

Sr. Kelly Francis from Drogheda will facilitate short retreats for second and sixth classes on Tuesday, 13th February. The retreats will take place in St. Anne's Resource Centre and St. Anne's Chapel. The pupils will be introduced to teenagers in Sr. Kelly Francis' youth group from Drogheda. Fifth classes will also attend for a short session.

Lenten Class Masses are usually celebrated in the assembly hall. As the hall is unavailable to us at the moment, Fr. Noel will celebrate one Mass for children from second to sixth classes on Wednesday, 6th March at 11.30am. If there is a funeral Mass on that day, our Mass will be moved to Thursday, 7th March at 11.30am.

Sports:

The boys' team, winners of the shield in the Cumann na mBunscoil tournament were presented with their medals in O'Mahonys on 13th December 2023. The boys were delighted to be addressed by Stephen Bray, Adam O'Neill and Cillian O'Sullivan. Ms. Hogan organised the ceremony and a presentation was given to Mr. Paul Brennan as the coach of the boys' team.

The fifth and sixth classes completed their six swimming lessons before Christmas. Third and Fourth Classes will begin their lessons in Aura, Navan, on 5th March. The Parents' Association will again cover the cost of transport to and from the swimming pool.

Music:

80 pupils took part in the choir for the Navan Silver Band Concert in the Newgrange Hotel on Sunday, 10th December. This event was greatly supported by parents and families. Many staff members also helped out on the night.

Say Yes to Languages

We were awarded €1,600 to run the 'Say Yes to Languages' Programme again this year. The Board of Management agreed to match this funding so that a total of 8 classes would benefit from the programme. Ms. Camelia Hangan will teach Romanian to four classes and Ms. Marina Mangan will teach Spanish to four classes. The aim of the programme is to expose children to the language of their peers and to create a more inclusive environment for all pupils.

Parents' Association:

There will be a phasing out of the old tracksuit. Children will be allowed to wear the old tracksuit until they have grown out of it. We will be going with navy uniform shorts for children to wear in May / June or to sports events. The cost of the uniform shorts will be €15.95.
- The Parents' Association funded the cost of transport to swimming lessons for 5th and 6th classes and will fund the cost of transport to swimming lessons for 3rd and 4th classes.
